SUPPORT WITH AMENDMENTS

AB153 (Include mental health services in health care coverage)

WATCH

SB121 (Improve special education for children incarcerated)

NOT SIGNED BY GOVERNOR

SB 1059 (Access to special education for foster children)





Trailer Bills: bills to make necessary changes to laws so new budget changes can be carried out legally

SCDD Recommendations:

Proposed changes must have process for appeals and exceptions, not risk health and safety, not more restrictive settings.

OPPOSE

Cap on yearly MediCal spending (durable medical equip., etc.)

OPPOSE

Reduce SSI/SSP to minimum required by federal government.

OPPOSE

Elimination of Adult Day Health Care Services.

SUPPORT

85% Regional Center \$\$ spent on direct service, with amendments.







SCDD Recommendations:

SUPPORT

Prohibition of Regional Center's using same accounting firm for 5 years every 10 years.

SUPPORT

Language about conflicts of interest of Regional Center board members and employees, with responsibility by DDS.

OPPOSE

MediCal limit of 6 prescription drugs per month.

OPPOSE

MediCal limits of Doctors visits to 10 per year.

OPPOSE

Cut of IHSS domestic services for people who have housemates or children living with parents.







SCDD Recommendations:

OPPOSE

Permanent reduction of IHSS by 3.6 % and more reductions by 12%.

OPPOSE

Requirement to get Dr. statement about needing IHSS or at risk of out-of-home placement.

OPPOSE

Development of statewide purchase of service standards.

SUPPORT

Ability to go after 3rd party or insurance for services when child (under 3 yrs.) is injured.

CLARIFICATION

Transition from Agnews and Lanterman DCs and health care systems.







SCDD Recommendations:

SUPPORT

Regional Centers report their boards follow the law & approve any contract over \$350,000.

OPPOSE

MediCal requiring enteral nutrition products for adults be limited.

OPPOSE

MediCal not covering over-the-counter cold products.

OPPOSE

Revising co-payments rates, requiring co-payments for more services.



- Help children get ready by using natural supports.
- Begin early to include children in neighborhood activities.
