The prevalence of mental health disorders within the population of persons with developmental disabilities ranges from 30 to 40 percent. When individuals are hospitalized in state psychiatric hospitals, their average stay is three times as long as that of non-developmentally disabled persons.

Despite such a critical need for professional attention, myths continue to persist that can and do prevent appropriate service delivery.


#### These myths include:

- Maladaptive behaviors are solely a function of the disability.
- Medication is the only treatment the mental health system can provide.
- One system or the other must take full responsibility for treatment.
