Convention on the Rights of Persons with



In 2009 the U.S. signed the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (CRPD). It is the first human rights

treaty of the 21st century and first to address disability rights globally.

General principles include:

- Respect for dignity and individual self-determination
- Freedom to make one's own choices, and independence
- Full participation in society
- · Respect for and acceptance of persons with disabilities
- · Equal opportunity and accessibility
